

Desert, Blame, and Punishment

Abstract: Legal punishment has two aspects: it condemns certain actions and prescribes some form of hard treatment for those found guilty of them. The paper presents a notion of desert-based justification and argues that moral blame, and the condemnatory aspect of legal punishment can be justified in this way, but hard treatment, such as incarceration, cannot. It then explores some implications of this view.
