# **Course Description**

This course is a critical and comparative study of Chinese philosophy with emphasis on analytic methods. It aims at providing students with the basic training of how to use analytic methods, such as logical analysis, linguistic and conceptual analysis, and thought experiments, in dealing with the main issues in Chinese philosophy.

# **Course Objectives**

Through a comparative study of Chinese and Western philosophy, students are expected to have a deep understanding of the characteristics of both philosophical

traditions, including their sameness and difference. This may be helpful for students to explore their philosophical horizon, to be able to use analytic methods to deal with problems in Chinese philosophy, and to investigate the deep level of meaning in Chinese thought.
