This course is an introduction to the key issues in social and political philosophy. Topics treated may include any of the following issues: the human nature; the origin and justification of the state; theories of rights, democracy, liberty, and distributive justice; the relation between ethics and politics.

2. Develop ideas of their own.
3. In their papers, students should reflect on their knowledge of various theories, as well as their own criticisms of them.
4. Develop own original views.
